We are counting to 100, and we are matching numbers to sets.

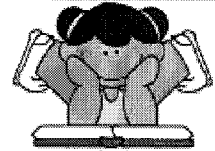
We have learned our color words, and we have learned the basic shapes.

Things to know!



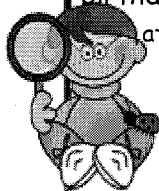
The end of the year is approaching very quickly. Lots of things to know!
